Pastoral Support	£9,000	To support children with social and emotional needs/difficulties to enable them to make good progress.	Greater support available for families particularly those with additional needs of SEMH and families in challenges circumstances.
Nurture Groups/Forest School	£5,000	To provide children with the opportunity to explore the outdoors whilst building valuable behaviours for learning which can then be applied in the classroom.	Nurture groups and 1:1 support have meant children with more severe difficulties able to access playtimes more successfully given structured support programme and in turn calmer in the classroom.
Year 6 and 2 Intervention Groups	£5,000	To provide extra support for those children who need it in the core subjects to enable them to make good progress.	These ran all year. Year 2 attainment in Maths and Writing increased on prior EY attainment.
Year 6 SATS Booster Sessions	£5,000	To provide extra support for children in the core subjects to enable them to achieve in their SATS tests.	These ran all year. Year 6 attainment in Maths, Reading and Writing increased based on prior KS1 attainment.
Sports Clubs	£2,000	To provide children with the opportunity to take part in sports activities over and above PE lessons, building confidence and vital skills such as teamwork and gross motor.	PP children encouraged to take part in sports clubs. Rise in Social and Emotional well-being and confidence.
Year 6 Residential Trip	£2,500	To enable children from low-income households to have the same opportunity as their peers in benefitting from the experience of a residential trip.	Pupil Premium children attended residential trip.
Swimming Lessons	£2,000	To enable children from low-income households to have the same opportunity as their peers in attending swimming lessons, thus gaining a vital life skill.	All attended weekly sessions.

Books for school library	£5,000	To promote reading and support learning in all classrooms by providing the children with new and engaging reading material on a regular basis.	Materials purchased and school library now a learning resource and additional books purchased for classes. Accelerated Reader now embedded to track children's engagement in reading.
Talk Boost Training for TAs	£500	To provide targeted and evidence-based intervention, which supports language delayed children to make significant progress with their language and communication skills.	Training provided by private employed Speech and Language therapist. She continued to work with staff to ensure it was being implemented and monitored accurately and to address difficulties with language in the Early Years.
Speech and Language Sessions	£6,000	To provide children with speech and language difficulties with the appropriate support and techniques to enable them to make good progress.	As above - individual and small groups. 1:1 sessions for children with individual care plans.
Milk	£300	To provide children from low-income households with milk to give them nutrition and energy.	All children receive milk - nutrition.
Extra TA provision across whole school	£45,000	To provide extra support in classes for intervention groups to take place to address misconceptions and consolidate learning.	Wide range of interventions run across the school consolidating key concepts and skills in core subjects.
General Trips	£2,200	To ensure all pupils have access to school trips to enrich their curriculum and remove the potential cost barrier.	All children attended curriculum enriching experiences and trips.
Malachi	£3,252	To provide vulnerable children and families with support in school and at home to help them with various social/emotional issues.	Greater support available for families particularly those with complex issues and children's social care.
SATS Breakfast Club	£100	To provide all year 6 pupils with a healthy breakfast and positive start to the day during their SATS.	All children attended, ate a healthy breakfast and were focussed and ready for the tests.
Whizz Kids Breakfast and After School Club	£1000	To provide some Pupil Premium families with funds to pay for their child to attend breakfast club and / or after school club so that the parents can go to work.	Families accessing this provision to enable them to return to work, numbers have increased.

Breakfast provision for vulnerable families	2,200	To provide all year 6 pupils with a healthy breakfast and positive start to the day	Nurturing environment has enabled a smooth transition from home to school for more vulnerable children.
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
